

We are glad you're here!

This is a community which strives to worship and serve God together. Within this community, people freely explore their personal questions about God and the Bible. It's together that we can better learn the breadth and depth of the Gospel and how it works out in our lives. Then, through the grace and hope of the gospel, we serve those in need and work together towards a thriving community.

This program is organized under five headings as described below:

Gathering: We remember God of Creation. The creator is amazing, perfect, powerful, good and is worthy of our worship and praise. This helps center and prepare our hearts for a time of worship.

Confession and Renewal reminds us that this world is not as God originally intended it. We express our grief and sorrow over the brokenness of this world and of our own lives. Our need for grace never goes away, and it is only by faith in Jesus that we can be made right with God. Within these words of renewal we recognize the truth that God's redemption of his people has been accomplished in Jesus.

Thanksgiving is our response to the redemptive plan of God. It is also an opportunity to express our thanks tangibly.

Ministry of the Word is expressed through reading our scripture passage for the day, listening to the Word preached, and responding with words of prayer from the congregation.

The *Benediction* is a good word to be sent out on.

We encourage you to spend some time before the service begins and note how it flows. You are also encouraged to take this bulletin with you to use for personal devotional time throughout the week.

Scripture Reading: Galatians 6:1-10

My dear family, if someone is found out in some trespass, then you—the 'spiritual' ones—should set such a person right, in a spirit of gentleness. Watch out for yourselves: you too may be tested. Carry each other's burdens; that's the way to fulfil the Messiah's law. If one of you thinks you are something when you are not, you deceive yourself. Every one of you should test your own work, and then you will have reason to boast of yourself, not of someone else. Each of you, you see, will have to carry your own load.

If someone is being taught the word, they should share with the teacher all the good things they have. Don't be misled; God won't have people turning their noses up at him. What you sow is what you'll reap. Yes: if you sow in the field of your flesh, you will harvest decay from your flesh, but if you sow in the field of the spirit, you will harvest eternal life from the spirit. Don't lose your enthusiasm for behaving properly. You'll bring in the harvest at the proper time if you don't become weary. So, then, while we have the chance, let's do good to everyone, and particularly to the household of the faith.

Invitation to the Table

- L Brothers and sisters in Christ, the gospels tell us that on the first day of the week, the day on which our Lord rose from the dead, he appeared to some of his disciples and was made known to them in the breaking of bread. Come, then, to the joyful feast of our Lord.
- A We receive this food gladly, believing, as we eat, that Jesus is our lifegiving food and drink and that he will come again to call us to the wedding feast of the Lamb.

Prayer of Thanks

A Gracious God, pour out your Holy Spirit upon us, that the bread we break and the cup we bless may be the communion of the body and blood of Christ. By your Spirit make us one with Christ, that we may be one with all who share this feast, united in ministry in every place.
